The design of the following materials is put together as such to help answer and clarify any questions or concerns that may come up during the school year. The discipline of the band program will develop <u>teamwork</u>, <u>cooperation</u>, <u>coordination</u>, <u>and self-discipline</u> that are not possible in other academic subjects. While the victories won and lost may seem to be the dominating desire, the main objectives of this band program are to encourage <u>individual ability</u>, <u>leadership</u>, <u>self-respect</u>, <u>and positive</u> <u>attitude</u>. Finally, please realize that other students and parents were in the exact position as you, having the same thoughts and fears. Anxiety of what lies ahead usually diminishes through active participation. We are here to help and hope that we can do so.

PROGRAM OBJECTIVES

PROGRAM GOALS: Students will develop the following skills and concepts:

- 1. A high degree of music reading encompassing: correct rhythm, tempo, dynamics, precision, tone and the ability to be versatile to any given musical circumstance.
- 2. The ability to work cooperatively with others toward the performance of music in an ensemble.
- 3. The knowledge of a wide variety of band literature.
- 4. A high level of quality artistry through individual musical awareness, control and technical facility.
- 5. Self-discipline, self-confidence, responsibility, and dependable behavior.
- 6. Respect for others, loyalty to ensemble, and pride in the organization.
- 7. Respect for and proper use of equipment.

SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES

The Christian County High School Band shall include the following essential elements and students will be expected to master the objectives in each of the identified areas:

- 1. Care and handling of instruments.
- 2. Posture and playing position.
- 3. Instrumental technique:
- a. Develop characteristic tone
- b. Develop listening and intonation skills
- c. Develop rhythmic skills
- d. Develop ability to phrase musically
- e. Develop dynamic control
- f. Develop articulation
 - 4. Musical reading skills

Understand and interpret printed musical symbols through performance on instrument.

- 5. Musical sensitivity
- 6. Evaluation of musical performance quality
 - a. Evaluate progress toward self-established musical goals.
 - b. Evaluate solo and group rehearsals and performances.
 - c. Recognize quality of sound, pitch, style, tempo, rhythm, blend, balance, phrasing, dynamics and articulation.
- 7. Creative self-expression
- 8. Develop strong personal skills in the areas of teamwork, leadership, and communication.

The rules and procedures outlined in this handbook have been developed to accomplish these goals in the most efficient and productive manner, and to provide an accurate method of assessing each student's progress. It is the personal and musical progress of each student, which has traditionally been based on the concept of each student performing his or her assigned tasks to the best of his or her ability. Each student is capable of making a contribution to the group and growing in knowledge and appreciation.

COURSE DESCRIPTION

- 1. **Marching Band** begins primarily in July and concludes in November. This group will perform at all home football games, at scheduled competitions, and in exhibition at home competitions. Rehearsals are held consistently and are scheduled well in advance so that all students can avoid unnecessary conflicts.
- 2. **Concert Band** begins primarily in October and usually concludes in May. This group will be evaluated at the district and possibly state level. Rehearsals are held consistently and scheduled well in advance so that all students can avoid unnecessary conflicts.
- 3. **Jazz Band** begins in class when school starts and concludes in May at the end of school. This group will be rated at the Jamey Aebersold Jazz Festival at Murray State University in the spring. Rehearsals are primarily during the school day during class. After-school rehearsals will be determined by the band director.
- 4. **Percussion Ensemble** begins in class and concludes in May at the end of school. The students will perform at the Christmas Concert, the Western Kentucky Day of Percussion, and the spring concert. Rehearsals are primarily during the school day during class. After-school rehearsals will be determined by the band director.
- 5. **Pep Band** plays at selected boys and girls basketball games (regular season and tournament) and at football playoff games. Students will be expected to play at the games assigned.
- 6. **Color Guard** will learn basic fundamentals and routine maintenance techniques for guard. This class is not required to be in colorguard. They will compose work and study advanced color guards.

ATTENDANCE POLICIES

ATTENDANCE

Absences affect performances and the success of performance-oriented activities such as band depends upon full participation. Each student's participation affects the group outcome and each student plays a valuable role in this process. Attendance guidelines have been developed to support the learning process for both the student and group. Attendance is related to both self-discipline and learning. If a student is not in rehearsal, he or she has missed that participatory portion of his or her educational experience and that experience cannot be made up. Students will be given a daily participation grade for all rehearsals and a performance grade for all performances.

ALL ABSENCES MUST BE REPORTED TO MR. DARNALL

Absences will be excused in the following and/or similar cases:

- Death in the family
- Medical emergency or illness
- Weddings (member of party or immediate family <u>ONLY</u>)

Absences will be unexcused in the following and/or similar cases:

- Family Trips, Babysitting
- Jobs
- Personal business or entertainment
- Class Tutorial (unless approved by Mr. Darnall in writing 24hrs prior)

The list of examples above does not cover every situation. The director is ultimately responsible for determining if an absence is excused or unexcused. In the case of illness or family emergency, an explanatory telephone call from a parent or guardian prior to a rehearsal or performance is appropriate. **INFORMATION ABOUT A STUDENT ABSENCE IS NOT TO BE REPORTED BY ANOTHER STUDENT!**

3 absences or failure to notify Mr. Darnall of one absence can result in a director/student/parent conference about the future involvement of the student with the CCHS Band.

An unexcused absence that will result in a grade of **ZERO** (0) for the event. Members may be removed from performances if rehearsals are missed due to illness, lengthy school absences, and/or excessive tardiness.

SUMMER BAND REHEARSALS

Summer rehearsal attendance is determined by the director. For a complete schedule of dates & times, please check your printed Christian County Band Calendar. Please remember to schedule vacations, doctor's appointments, summer camps, etc. around the band camp schedule. Know that all absences affect the ultimate success of the band.

Required Attire for Summer Rehearsals:

Please don't wear tube top, bikini tops, high top shoes, sandals, flip-flops or clogs. Avoid wearing clothing that is provocative, revealing, offensive, or that contains drug/alcohol related words or symbols.

GRADING POLICIES

STANDARD GRADING POLICY *Will be suspended until approved by administration due to COVID-19*

Students in band class will be graded according to the following plan:

Rehearsals (50 pts. each week)

• Students will be given a grade based on their attendance, attitude, preparedness, and participation at **ALL** scheduled rehearsals (both after school rehearsals and sectionals).

Performances (100 pts. each event)

• Students will be given a grade based on their attendance and participation at **ALL** performances (include contest, concerts, ball games, etc.).

Playing Assessments (Points will vary)

- Students will be assessed periodically over any tested material
- Playing tests will be given over a variety of materials such as:

Music Material

- 1. Scales- Major &/or Minor
- 2. Arpeggios- Major &/or Minor
- 3. Marching Music
- 4. Memorization of Music
- 5. Concert Music
- 6. Etudes
- 7. Sight Reading

Musical Content

- 1. Tone Quality
- 2. Intonation
- 3. Style
- 4. Rhythmic Accuracy
- 5. Precision & Articulation

Written Assessments (Points will vary)

• Students will be given various small and large written assignments to make sure there is full understanding of basic terms and concepts.

NTI 2020-2021 GRADING POLICY

Students in band class will be graded according to the following plan:

Weekly playing Grade (25 pts. a week)

• Students will be given a weekly playing assignment that they must record and submit via Canvas.

Weekly Written Grade (25 pts. a week)

• Students will be given a weekly written assignment (music theory based) that they must complete and submit via Canvas

Written Quiz (50 pts per Quiz)

• Students will be given music theory based quizzes based on weekly written assignments. These Quizzes will be given via Canvas at the discretion of the Instructors.

Playing Quiz (50 pts per Quiz)

• Periodically, students will be given a playing quiz. These Quizzes will be video submissions in the Canvas Platform. The quizzes will be given at the discretion of the Instructors.

Written Test (100 pts per Test)

• Students will be given music theory based tests based on weekly written assignments and quizzes. These Tests will be given via Canvas at the discretion of the Instructors.

Playing Test (100 pts per Test)

• Periodically, students will be given a playing Test. These Tests will be video submissions in the Canvas Platform. The quizzes will be given at the discretion of the Instructors.

Midterm and Final Exam will follow school policy (Point totals, weighted totals, etc).

- 1. Scales- Major &/or Minor
- 2. Arpeggios- Major &/or Minor
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CLASSROOM MATERIAL POLICIES

MATERIALS REQUIRED

- 1. All students are required to bring a pencil (not pen) to class daily.
- 2. All students must have and bring to class daily:
 - *Brass Players:* 3 ring binder with sheet protectors, instrument, music, valve oil (slide cream and water bottle for trombones), and appropriate mutes.
 - *Percussionists:* 3 ring binder with sheet protectors, music, appropriate sticks/mallets in mallet bag, drum pad. All Percussionists are required to purchase their first pair of sticks/mallets. The 2nd set will be provided. If you abuse, damage, or lose the mallets...it is your responsibility to replace them in a timely fashion.

- Woodwind Players: 3 ring binder with sheet protectors, instrument, music, working reeds, cleaning swab as needed, and cork grease (double reed players need a small container for water).
- *Color Guard:* rifle if on rifle line, shoes, appropriate make-up when needed.
- 3. All Students are required to have their pep folders if assigned at rehearsals and performances.
- 4. Concert dress attire for performances (see dress code section)

<u>PERFORMANCES</u> *Performances are subject to change in 2020-2021 school year due to COVID-19*

The Christian County Colonel Band performs at several events throughout the school year. The marching band performance season begins in September and ends late October/early November. The marching band will play/perform in scheduled band competitions, exhibition at the home marching competition, at all home football games, the HopTown-County game (when CCHS are visitors), all playoff games (home and away) and State Football Championships. The marching band also participates in various parades each year. The band also plays at selected boys & girls basketball home games and playoffs. The concert band will perform a winter and spring concert and will attend concert band festival assessment at the district and/or state level.

ADDITIONAL PERFORMANCE OPPORTUNITIES

Clinics, solos and ensembles are important opportunities for students to participate in musical experiences outside the Christian County High School Band. Students are encouraged to participate in solo and ensembles because it allows the student to perform in a setting that differs from large ensembles. The student and director will choose musical literature, which will best challenge the student's ability. Clinics enable all students to participate with students from other schools in band. These are usually held on the weekend. These clinics are often held on college campuses and expose the students to other band directors in preparation for a concert to be held at the end of the clinic.

PERFORMANCE RULES

- 1. Keep yourself to yourself at all times.
- 2. No food in the stands during the game. Can have drinks with Director's approval.
- 3. No playing of instruments in the stands unless directed by the Field Commander or Directors.
- 4. All students stay for the entire performance or dismissal by Directors.

BAND RULES AND CLASSROOM EXPECTATIONS

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OTHER NOTES:

- 1. **Appropriate behavior is expected at all times! PROFESSIONALISM** and **RESPONSIBILITY** are required from every student. School/Board policies apply, and dismissal from the ensemble can occur if rules are broken.
- 2. Inappropriate language will not be tolerated by **ANYONE** associated with the band.
- 3. **TAKE CARE OF YOUR THINGS!** Each student is responsible for his/her own music and equipment. Any repairs and/or problems with music or equipment must be taken care of before rehearsal.
- 4. **No food, drinks, gum or candy will be allowed in the band room!** This is your room-TAKE CARE OF IT! Our room should show professionalism.
- 5. No public display of affection/inappropriate behavior!
- 6. Students will sit together at concerts, contests and at football games when not performing.

BUS TRIP RULES

- 1. The bus driver is in control of the bus and the chaperones will assist the driver.
- 2. Maintain two people to a seat.
- 3. Do not block the aisle at any time.
- 4. Do not yell out the windows or put any part of yourself out of the windows.
- 5. Use the restroom before we leave. We are on strict timelines and cannot stop.
- 6. Leave the bus the way you found it, clean and with the windows up.
- 7. Don't forget to "THANK" the driver and chaperones for assisting in making your trip safe and enjoyable.
 - 8. Do not ask to drive to any trips.
- 9. **Students must ride the bus to <u>ALL</u> school events.** Students may ride home with a parent <u>ONLY</u> if a written note from the parent is given to the director before leaving with the student. We are responsible for you and must know your whereabouts at all times.
- 10. No changing from one bus to another unless it's a director's discretion.

MARCHING BAND DRESS CODE

Dress Code will be altered for the 2020-2021 school year due to COVID 19

All students wearing a band uniform must wear under the uniform:

- LONG BLACK SOCKS
- **SHORTS** lightweight without extra pockets on the sides.
- **SHOW SHIRT** Given to every marching band member will be used on competition days.
- Long hair will be pinned up and secured under the uniform hat (there are many parents who will help with this.)

Students will remain in <u>FULL UNIFORM</u> at each contest until otherwise instructed by the band director. DON'T WALK AROUND IN HALF UNIFORM (unless specified by director)!

CONCERT BAND DRESS CODE

Male Students:

- Black button down long-sleeve shirt and black undershirt
- Black dress pants
- Black socks & shoes
- Black belt

Female Students:

- All Black Dress- Full Length
- Black dress shirt/blouse with sleeves
- Black skirt (past knee when sitting) or black dress slacks
- Black panty hose (if wearing a skirt or dress)
- Black shoes (closed toe, no tall heels)

YEARLY BAND AWARDS

Band Members have the opportunity to earn a varsity letter for participation. Letters will be awarded at the Spring Banquet at the end of the year. Students lettering for the first time will receive a letter. Returning students will receive one chevron for each additional year. Students may letter in band no more than once a year.

Additional recognition will be given for participating in solo & ensemble festival and various other ensembles. Additionally, outstanding students will be recognized at the Banquet for exceptional merit as shown throughout the year as a band student. Students who successfully participate in band are eligible for other awards such as the John Phillip Sousa Award. These and other awards are presented to outstanding students at the annual banquet. Senior members will receive a pink stole for graduation upon completing their senior year. Stoles will not be given to students who do not complete their senior year.
